



Adding Nexternal Domains to Your typekit.net Font Kit

When styling your store in your initial sync or a re-sync, our design team members do their best to match the styling on your website. However, we can only use your website fonts in your store if we have the appropriate permissions to use them. Therefore, if your website includes fonts hosted by typekit.net, you must complete the following before we can do our site sync. If you do not do this, the fonts will not show up on your store pages.

Please add the following Nexternal domains to your typekit.net font kit ASAP, and let your Account Manager know when it's done:

store.nexternal.com
oms.nexternal.com

And, if your store uses a domain alias such as **store**.firstfairway.com or **shop**.firstfairway.com, then you also need to add:

YourDomainAlias>YourDomain.com
